Dear Parents and Carers,

What a fabulous start to the term we have had! Year 5 have visited Kentwell Hall on their Tudor trip, Year 1 have been learning about action words, clubs have started and our first share afternoon has taken place. We have been exploring the idea of fairness in our assemblies which has then been followed up back in the classroom. The children are all studying a new power of reading book (try asking them which book they are reading) and we are deepening the challenge in our Maths lessons.

Our new school development plan is focussing on 4 Key areas:

- To ensure equality and equity across the school community
- To ensure there is diversity across the curriculum in all subjects
- To improve the use and understanding of punctuation and grammar
- To increase the opportunity for challenge in Mathematics

After half term we will be holding an open evening where we can share our school priorities and enable parents to gain a better understanding of how we teach. There will also be our Autumn term parent consultation evenings on November 1st and 2nd. Mrs Leeks will also be holding SEND coffee mornings. 
Year One


Year Two

A great start to the new academic year.






Year Four
