**Class: Tigers and Panthers** 

Our topic this half term is: Crime & Punishment

#### Our learning this half term:

- Highwayman, by Alfred Noyes. This classic poem, tells the story ill-fated love story between a highwayman and Bess, the landlords daughter. We will be exploring the language used and using those techniques to deepen our own knowledge. We will be using inference, prediction, storyboarding, role play, story writing and discussion to enhance our understanding of the text.
- Maths: Multiplication and division and fractions— Multiplication and division are two of the most important elements of maths learning for Year 5 children. As skills, they have many practical uses from paying for shopping to telling the time. And mastering those skills will enable your child to tackle a wide range of other maths topics, including fractions, percentages and algebra.
- Topic: Crime and punishment. Our focus will be on crime and punishment throughout time and across different countries. We will look at how the definition of crime has shifted over time and how different cultures punish and deal with crime.
