| Implementation | TEACHING Some RSHE lessons will be taught as discrete lessons and others may be delivered in a more cross curricular way. All Sex education lessons in Year 5 and 6 will be taught to split gender groups. | | |
| | CULTURAL DIVERSITY Our RSHE curriculum is accessible to all pupils and enables them to learn regardless of their starting point of knowledge. We support all young people to stay safe and prepare for life in modern Britain. We ensure a breadth of cultures are studied and that the children feel represented by the people they learn about. Parents are informed about each half term's topics on the half termly parent leaflet. 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| Impact | <p>PUPIL VOICE</p> <p>Through discussion and feedback, children talk enthusiastically about their RSHE and understand the importance of this subject.</p> <p>Pupils use skills learnt in RSHE when making decisions in their everyday life.</p> <p>Regular pupil voice occurs as part of subject leader monitoring.</p> | <p>EVIDENCE IN KNOWLEDGE</p> <p>Pupils understand and can use the key terminology and concepts taught within the RSHE programme. Pupils can use correct vocabulary when describing their bodies and relationships. Pupils have the knowledge to enable them to make informed decisions and to develop healthy, nurturing relationships at all stages of their life.</p> | <p>EVIDENCE IN SKILLS</p> <p>Children are taught RSHE progressively and at a pace appropriate to their year group and development. Teachers subject knowledge ensures that the skills taught are matched to the Statutory RSHE guidance.</p> |
| <p>OUTCOMES</p> <p>At the end of each year we expect the children to have an understanding of the skills and knowledge covered. Children who have gaps in their knowledge may need to receive appropriate support and intervention through Thrive or additional support.</p> | | | |
