

This Month's Highlights

BIG NEWS in EYFS this week- A crash was heard by Mrs Clements and the teachers before school and when we looked we found some strange looking footprints! The children came in and were really excited to find out who they might belong to. Some of the children's ideas were: an ostrich, a bog baby, a T-Rex, a lion, a leopard looking to eat beef... When we looked we found some more clues about the monster and thought about what they could mean: a red feather so it must have red fur, pink water in the toilet so it must have pink wee, footprints that were much larger than our own so it must be taller than us. This led us on to talking about monsters and beginning our new Power of Reading book 'Bedtime for Monsters' we decided that they don't always have to be 'scary.' We are looking forward to making up our own monsters and writing stories about them.







Year One



In year 1 we have been enjoying our new story 'The Secret Sky Garden' and have explored the main character, Funni.

Funni enjoys spending her time at the top of an old airport car park and had the idea of making this into a Sky Garden for everyone to see. The children had lots of fun making their very own gardens, just like Funni, whilst thinking carefully about the different imperative verbs they used.

In Art, we have begun to explore the artist Yvonne Coomber and her love of wild flowers. The children are busy experimenting with different painting techniques and are excited to create their final art piece.







Year Two

Year 2's space journey has been well under well this term. We have been learning all about Rocket and her inspiration to be an astronaut. We have created persuasive posters to encourage people to join Rocket in watching a meteor shower. During choose our learning the children used these skills to create their own posters and protests around their topics important to them. We have also been researching what a meteor shower is and completing investigations around the impact large meteorites have on the earth. We even found time to make space buggies using mechanisms for wheels and axles. Some of the children applied these new skills to create a moving picture.









Year Three



Year 3 have been introduced to The Green Belt Movement. Our new book, Mama Miti has allowed us to explore Kenya and the importance plants/trees play in our society. We have researched different trees and planted our own flowers too. We have also looked at the Science behind plants. The story also allows us to explore the dilemmas of the characters and offer advice from multiple perspectives.







Year Four

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We have been learning about the process of Egyptian Mummification in history and in DT we have made a mummy and a sarcophagus. We have been researching facts about the River Nile and also its importance to the Ancient Egyptians.

Year 4 have had another hectic month and after weeks of hard work and determination, they took part in the WCET Music Festival at Trinity Park. They practised all four of their learnt pieces for flute and violin from their weekly lessons several times all morning, then learnt a new traditional African shanty with the voice coach from SCC. Finally, the day culminated with a wonderful performance for parents. It was a marvellous celebration of their music and they were a credit to the Dale Hall School community.









Year Five









This month we have been looking at the properties of shape in maths by exploring angles and perimeter. We learnt how to use protractors to measure and draw angles and took part in some hands-on investigations to strengthen and deepen our knowledge.

We have also been continuing our space topic and used our understanding of the colours and patterns of each planet to begin to create our very own planet cushions.

Stage one was to use the tie dye technique to create the swirls, stripes and pockets of colour that each plant displays. We then chose the appropriate colours during our very messy, but very fun DT lesson! We can't wait to see the finished product.

Year Six

In Year 6 our 'Power of Reading' book has prompted lots of work and discussion about displacement and race this month. The whole year group have shown such maturity and kindness throughout.

We have been fortunate enough to work with Alice, an artist who specialises in bronze sculptures. We took the first steps in creating mini-statues of 'the best versions of ourselves.'

We look forward to finishing these at her art studio next week.

Our last few weeks have also consisted of lots of preparation for the upcoming Year 6 Production. We have been so busy making props and rehearsing. The children have been incredible and are so excited to perform to the rest of the school and their parents!
