PE and Sport Premium Funding 2021 – 2022

The Department of Education allocates a PE & Sport Premium fund of £16,000 plus £10 per pupil to our school each year - we received £19,570 in 2021/22.

Our goals for this year:

- **Improvements to the facilities and equipment to reflect the standard expected of children.**
- **Children to develop physical skills and reignite the love for exercise after periods of time in lockdown**
- **Children being inspired to be active, allowing them to choose equipment as well as shaping their own learning.**

The Government provides this funding to improve the quality of PE and Sport in schools and academies that have children of primary school age. Our Health and Activities Leader has generated an action plan for 2021/22 that incorporates both 'catch-up' initiatives and other health and wellbeing strategies from this year's plan, linking to each school's action plan priorities. This takes into account the DfE's guidance relating to spending time supporting children returning to school after COVID-19 as well as the usual sporting and fitness priorities.

The information below summarises how we plan to use our funding for PE and Sport in our school during 2021/22 to impact on the quality of the provision for PE and sport in our school.

£500 Health and Activities Leader Our HAL provides leadership and management to promote: physical, social, emotional and mental health and equip pupils, staff and families with the skills and attitudes to make informed decisions about their health. All pupils at Dale are expected to exhibit excellent levels of behaviour and our HAL will arrange clubs to ensure that all children will have the opportunity to engage in activities thus improving the children's behaviour during lunch times and giving them that sense of belonging therefore positively impacting on their attitudes.

£500 Social, Emotional and Mental Health Lead Our SEMH lead provides leadership to ensure there is high-quality inclusive teaching, a reduced number of playground incidents, and there is improved standards of learning and achievement for all. . He is developing Peer Mediators using CRESST (Conflict resolution for young people by young people) and is establishing Peer mediators this year with the aim to enable to moderate and improve behaviour at lunchtime.

£15,984 Specialist coaches (Premier Sport) - Continued CPD opportunities across the school through the use of specialist coaches that enable all staff to provide high quality PE teaching across the school. This also involves our Forest school leader to take 15 children to deliver their sessions every afternoon.

£1,686 Resources & outdoor development and membership – Fund the purchase of additional PE and playground equipment to ensure pupils are provided with a range of opportunities to be physically active both indoors and outdoors. Use the student and community voice to develop outdoor space to provide further opportunities for physical activity, mental wellbeing and active learning as part of a varied curriculum. This also includes payment for Get Set 4 PE membership for access to planning and assessment online resources for EYFS and KS1. This will support teachers in the delivery of high-quality PE and enabling PE lead to track assessment of children to enable targeted support to be accessed as needed.

£900 Bike ability- To be carried over to fund the delivery of Bikeability to Year 6 pupils, who missed Bikeability due to Covid restrictions in the year 2020-21.
