**We are Ipswich and South Suffolk U11 Boys Cricket Champions!**



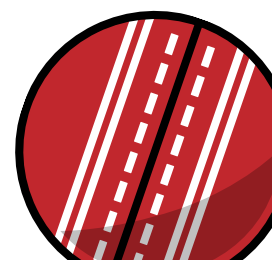
